Reading

Please use the attached Reading Log to record the books you read this summer. Students should be reading at least 10 minutes everyday. While students are not required to read a certain number of books during the summer, OLV encourages students to experience reading in as many ways as possible. Seeing the adults around them reading is essential; having materials at hand is key. Read together as a family; read with your child; ask your child to read to you, to each other, to your pet. Try reading magazines, signs, recipes, games, the comics, directions, instructions, or invitations. Write a postcard, write an e-mail, write a letter, write a poem, write a story, keep a journal – reading and writing go together. You could even plan a visit to meet friends at your public library!
