







Congratulations Golden Apple Award Winner 2019 Tommy Corrigan



This past May when OLV teacher Tommy Corrigan won a 2019 Golden Apple Award for Excellence in teaching, he was greeted with cheers, balloons and student appreciation posters. OLV principal Sheila Martinez enthusiastically asked the students, "How glad are you that he said 'yes' to God's call?"

Mr. Corrigan is known for making the classroom fun through Star Wars jokes, games, dancing and whistling during class, and doing cartoon impersonations. Mrs. Martinez said he "brings to school every day the joy of the Gospel."

"He does have this deep personal faith, and he engages with his students, particularly about how their actions and their faith are connected together."

Corrigan attended Catholic school from grade school through college and said as he was discerning the call to become a teacher he "realized that many of the values and strategies that I have and that I put to use every day in the way I live with my family, colleagues and students were gained from Catholic education."

"It is so much fun, and it is rewarding. Every day I leave feeling like I have made a difference and every night I have the hope that the next day I can also make a difference in my students, colleagues and my family's lives," Corrigan explained.
